In the future, robots coexist with human beings. The World moves on and the robots do their job of helping people - until they began to think for themselves. The government is not happy with this, and orders all the robots on the planet to be locked up and destroyed.

And so the robots are almost extinct. Almost. One day, Clara, a girl in a wheelchair, goes a long way from home and arrives at a concentration camp. There she meets a robot, probably the last robot on planet Earth. Thus they start a deep friendship based on silence and understanding. But something terrible happens and they are separated.

70 years later, the robot reawakens and begins the search for Clara in a world that has changed, and where intolerance of difference reigns. "Robot" is a performance made mostly using recycled materials. As usual with David Zuazola's work, the mechanisms, stage design and compelling characters inhabit a different, unique world of powerful stories, far from all conventions.
